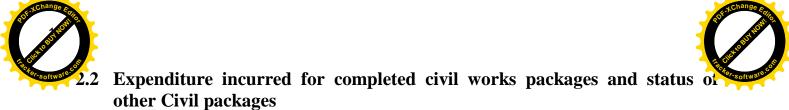

#### 2.7 Report of Progress of R & D Activities

The first meeting of the Research Guidance Committee (RGC) for TEQIP II of CE Karunagappally was held on 22.2.2014 under the Chairmanship of Senior Research Advisor of the Institution, Dr. Gopinathan E, Former Director of NIT Kozhikode in the presence of Dr. Rajkumar Choudhary, Scientist, Space Physics Laboratory, VSSC and Sri. Shajahan M, Scientist, Space Physics Laboratory, VSSC Thiruvananthapuram. Based on the decisions of the RGC, seed money at the tune of Rs. 1,00,000/- per Principal Investigator was paid for eight proposals strictly adhering to the rules and regulations framed for granting the seed money. As per the guidelines for granting seed money the progress report and utilization of funds should be reported every six months. Hence the Principal Investigators (PI) were asked to submit the progress reports and the reports submitted by them were sent to the Chairman and external members for review. Accordingly the Second meeting of RGC was conducted on 06.12.2014 under the Chairmanship of the SRA of the Institution, Dr. Gopinathan E. The external members of the Committee also were present in the meeting. After first level scrutiny, the applicants were asked to present their proposals before the RGC. All the PIs presented the progress of the projects. All the PIs presented that they would sumbit the final proposals to external funding agencies in February 2015. The committee appreciated and congratulated the efforts taken by all the faculty members for the progress made in all the projects for which seed money was availed. The committee urged the PIs to accelerate further to finish the projects within the time frame. The draft minutes of the second meeting of RGC is attached as Annexure-4.

In the 6<sup>th</sup> review meeting of the TEQIP II activities conducted by SPFU on 06.11.2014, CE Karunappally was invited to present the R and D activities as the best practice in R and D of the 19 TEQIP institutions.

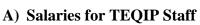

# Item No 2.1 Expenditure incurred for procurement of goods and price revisions of various completed and Committed packages

BOG members enquired about the price variation seen in the estimated and actual amount of Package no:TEQIPII/KL1G18/7 and Package No:TEQIP/II/KL1G18/150. They insisted to provide proper justification and documentation for the encountered price variations. They also suggested that specification and reliability of items should be properly analyzed before estimating the cost of the items. BOG members analyzed all the tables kept under the Item No2.1 and approved all the variations.

# Item No 2.2 Expenditure incurred for completed civil works packages and status of other Civil Packages

Based on the ajenda 2.2, BOG members inquired the status of package Extension of generator room No:TEQIP11/KL/1G18/130. Mr.Shaji.L, coordinator, civil works committee and Principal informed that this civil work is coupled with another package Unitized substation No. No:TEQIP11/KL/1G18/125. The 500 transformer for the substation has not yet arrived. On its arrival, it is to be mounted on the platform constructed under the package No:TEQIP11/KL/1G18/130 using crane. So the side walls and roof cannot be constructed until then. Furthermore, the cable trench constructed under the civil work TEOIP11/KL/1G18/130 cannot be until the HT cable to be purchased under the package No:TEQIP11/KL/1G18/125 is laid and connected to the 11KV line and approval from Electrical Inspectorate is obtained. So the civil work cannot be completed before the commissioning of substation. On hearing this, BOG decided to complete the formalities regarding transformer purchase as soon as possible and then fix an extension period for the package No:TEQIP11/KL/1G18/130 for one month from the date of renewal of contract for the civil work package No:TEQIP11/KL/1G18/130 and asserted that there should not be any more extension. Also it has been decided to pass the pending part payment for the above civil work on the renewal of contract.

The packages College electrical work No:TEQIPII/KL/1G18/160 and partitioning work No:TEQIP11/KL/1G18/127 came under discussion. The coordinator explained that the package partitioning work No:TEQIP11/KL/1G18/127 was delayed as the semi-finished tables in it were damaged in an accident on transit from Alappuzha to the institution. The damaged items were needed to be replaced and this additional work needed some extension. The electrical connections in the civil work No:TEQIP11/KL/1G18/160 that were intended for these tables could not be completed in time. The time period for both packages No:TEQIP11/KL/1G18/160 and No:TEQIP11/KL/1G18/127 were to be extended for four months. The coordinator, civil works committee also explained that both works are presently





over. The BOG ratified the above extension and passed the payment No:TEQIP11/KL/1G18/160.

# 1.5 Item No 1.2 / RGC 3: Evaluation of the progress of the projects based on the Extension request reports submitted by the Principal Investigators

The extension report submitted by the Principal Investigators (PIs) were discussed in detail. The comments received from the Hon'ble Chairman were also discussed. The Committee decided to find the reality and further, the Principal Investigators were asked to present the progress of the proposals.

# 1.6 Item No 1.3 / RGC 3: Evaluation of the projects based on the presentations by the Investigators

The Committee asked the Faculty members to present the progress of the proposals and the presentations started at 10.30 am in the Seminar Hall. The Principal Investigators presented the progress of the projects and the details of the discussions are given below:

#### 1. Video Tampering Detection –An application to video forensics - Remya R S

The Principle Investigator(PI) explained the work done in this project with results. All the external members enquired about the relevance of 100 percentage results and PI explained the factors incorporated in this project. Shajahan sir asked to get help from forensic department for the verification. Remya enquired the joint submission with C-DAC persons and CET for helping in this work. But nobody ready to accept this project. Remya asked for an extension of six months. The committee initially provided 4 months. Since she plan to do Internship at IIT Delhi for 2 months from May to July(6-8 weeks), she will get a total of six months. Committee told that she can efficiently utilize the resources at IIT Delhi during this period advised her to complete the work by that time.

#### 2. Automatic detection of Lymphocytic Luekemia- Remya R S

PI presented the progress of the project. For Project proposal, she contacted RCC, submitted permission from IRB, IRB Sanctioned the permission and MOU format discussion is going on. Members asked about the funding agency and PI replied to submit before ICMR. A MOC proposal is sent to ICMR. PI is Dr. Hariharan, HoD(Cytogenetic Deptment). She presented the expenditure statement and explained the reasons for the extension. For signing the MOU related discussions and MOC proposal acceptance need 4 months. Gopinathan sir suggested to publish in journal rather than for presenting before conferences.

- 3. Handwritten character recognition from manuscripts written in ancient Grantha scripts &
- 4. Handwritten character recognition of various ancient and current Malayalam fonts- JYOTHI R L

PI presented the developments in the project work and discussed about the results obtained and the stage of the proposal. She submitted a paper for an international conference at Tunisia and the acceptance will be known only on May  $24^{th}$ . Choudhary sir suggested not to send latest work developments to conference and also added that to publish in reputed journals. PI accepted it and she is waiting for good results to publish in journal. She also explained that modification of the zone based analysis is a new idea and nobody tried it. Gopinathan sir suggested to send it in a journal. Gopinathan sir & shajahan sir jointly suggested that even though the paper is rejected, you will get excellent comments on the paper and it will help you to improve. PI asked for 3 months extension for finding a PI. All members opined that the researcher of this institution must be PI and make the other person as Co - PI.

Gopinathan sir asked about the need of only 3 months? Can you complete by this time? PI replied that the procedures for MoU, consent from LBS etc need to be completed and hope to complete these procedures within three months. As the PI has asked for extn for three months only, she has to complete all the works by this time. Further time will not be given for extension.

5. Smitha: Automated Cancer Detection and Grading of Breast Microscopy Images

PI presented the developments in the project work and discussed about the results obtained and the stage of the proposal. **Shajahan sir & Choudhary sir** asked why automation is not yet done and Why 3 years needed for further work? PI replied that the detection is done only for 2 types of cancer cells. Detection of many other types of cancers are in breast cells, have to be done. She asked for 6 months extension. This is needed for the submitting the project proposal through RCC, Trivandrum and proposal is under the consideration of IRB of pathology department. But there is an opinion difference among the IRB members. So they redirected for an opinion from outside that institution and waiting for the reply. **Gopinathan sir** asked about the journal publications and Investigator replied that she had sent it for Biomedical Research Journal.

### 6. Deepa A K - Image Processing Techniques for Breast Image Analysis

PI asked to explain the extension request and she told that she need 4 months extension because she discussed it with the RCC Trivandrum and they had accepted to provide before their IRB. She is waiting for the result. She explained about the results obtained in this work. All the members are satisfied with the result and they asked to prepare journal papers to publish in reputed journals.

7. **Shajy.** L: Early Lung Cancer Detection Through Extraction And Analysis Of Sputum Cell Images

PI presented the details and the results achieved in the work. Choudhary sir enquired about the results of existing methods and the PI replied that the accuracy of this method is better than existing method (Got 89.8%, while existing is only 86%). Gopinathan sir asked about the publications and PI replied that he has published in a IEEE explore and another paper is under publication of another journal. PI asked for six months extension and both this project and smitha's project are under same Co-PI from RCC and also a common proposal given in IRB, awaiting the results due to the same reasons stated by smitha.

8. **Hari V S:** The visualization and modeling of raw MRI signals for volume segmentation and estimation.

PI explained the progress in the work and discussed about the results obtained. Shajahan sir and gopinathan sir asked about the filter usage in this work. PI explained it and requested for 4 months extension for getting the IRB sanction and MoU between SCTIMS, Trivandrum. Dr. Kesavadas Chandrasekar accepted this work and will be assisting in this work. Choudary sir asked about the paper work and publishing done in this work. PI explained that work is in progress and will be publishing soon.

#### 1.4 Any other matter regarding improvement of Research and Development

After completing all the presentations a meeting was conducted at the principals chamber and chairman appreciated the work and its status. All the members accepted all the requests as they felt the reality in the request. Sir also suggested that the PI must be from our institution and the other supporting persons from outside must be co-PI's. This was accepted by all the other external members. Similarly for the MOU discussions with the other institutions Principal and TEQIP Coordinator should also accompany the PI. Then the discussion will be considered in higher level and will be proceeded in proper direction. Also the new work should be published in journals not in conferences. This also accepted by all the external members. External members are ready to help the projects in any situation. Shajahan sir also accepted to help with some boards at VSSC. After having a Tea and snacks the meeting adjourned.

We have audited the *Project financial statements of College of Engineering*, *Karunagapally*, *Kerala under TEQIP Phase II* for the year ending 31st March, 2014 and have issued our consolidated report dated 26.09.2014 The matters involving the internal accounting control structure and its operations that we consider to be material weakness in accordance with the standards referred to above have been dealt with in our audit report.

The following observations were examined during the course of the audit on the accounting records, systems and control:

- 1. The Project Institution follows Cash System of Accounting for accounting the activities of *TEQIP Phase II*.
- We have noticed that, the documentations in respect of transactions effected at the Project Institution under TEQIP Phase II need to be improved.
- 3. We have noticed that the institution maintains "Four Funds" but not accounted transactions fully in the books of accounts (tally). So we are not in a position to identify the transactions in these accounts. As per the Confirmations received.

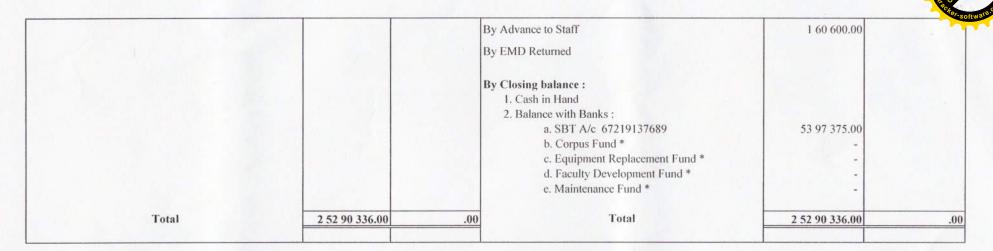

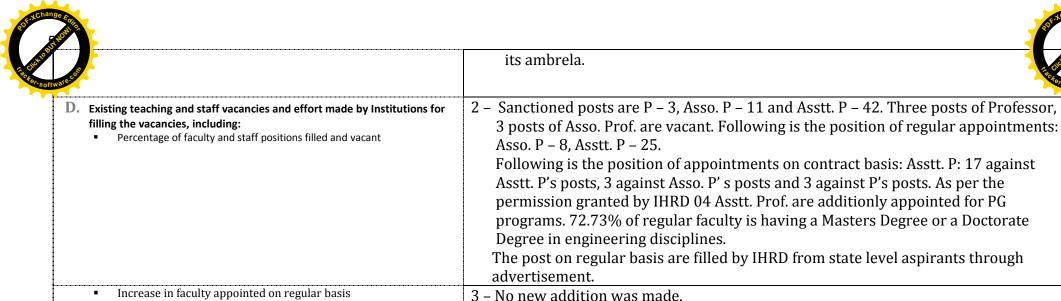
